THE LORD'S PRAYER


Our Father who art in heaven,

Dear Lord, we thank you today for the good things that we receive in our lives that keep us safe and make us happy. It is so easy for us to forget how fortunate we are to have loving families, food to eat and to live without illness. Like the nine lepers in the Bible story, we can become so busy thinking about ourselves that we take these things for granted without remembering to offer words of thanks.

In these difficult times we remember those who risk their own lives for the good of us all; for doctors and nurses on the front line caring for people suffering from the Covid 19 virus; for people who serve others in shops and so are more likely to become ill; and for those in the welfare services who provide daily care to people in need of help.
